North Carolina – The First Gold Rush and the Charlotte Mint, by Stephen Petty - 10:30 am

Mr. Petty will be providing a history of the U.S.'s first gold rush that began in western North Carolina along with the history of the Charlotte Mint and the coins it produced. The story begins with a boy fishing who found a massive nugget of gold, but didn't realize it was gold for many years and ends with the closing of the Mint caused by the Civil War. The Charlotte Mint produced only gold coins and most are considered to be rare. Come enjoy this early history of gold being discovered in the United States.

Stephen is currently President the Central Ohio Numismatic Association (CONA) in Columbus, Ohio. His collecting specialty is Liberty Seated Dollars and Trade Dollars, having completed both sets. When he isn't working with coins he works as a forensics engineer and an expert witness on exposures to chemicals and other hazards.

Overrated / Underrated Liberty Seated Coinage, by Dennis Fortier - 1:00 pm

This presentation is an in-depth study of all seven Liberty Seated denominations for being overrated (overpriced) or underrated (underpriced) in the current market place. Dennis Fortier is the Vice-President of the Liberty Seated Collectors Club and President of the Seated Half Society. Mr. Fortier has been a dedicated collector of liberty Seated Half Dollars and a student numismatist of the series for two decades. Mr. Fortier is an author and is a two time winner of the Liberty Seated Collectors Club's Ahwash Award for the best article of the year. Mr. Fortier is also an ANA presenter, and has given presentations all over the country.
